Here are the highlights of what we have been up to.....

With support from Wole Soyinka Center for Investigative Journalism, we started a program on our platforms called Women's weekly dose, where we engage stakeholders and policymakers on issues that concern women, girls and women with disabilities. This program is a weekly edition and is focused on reviewing and discussing proposed policies that is inclusive and accountable.







We partnered with **The Skilled Women Initiatives Nigeria Company on an e-mobility training.** The training was a creation of awareness on the importance of electric motorcycles and vehicles. The importance of this training goes beyond reduction of pollution in Nigeria, it gives room for job opportunities for women and brings about an inclusive democracy.







Our Executive Director was one of the facilitators at **Farm Radio International.** The training focused on Unpaid Care, especially for women and girls. Unpaid care is one of the most unnoticed topics yet to be included in conversations, reason being that it has not been put on the spotlight as a major issue faced by women. The training centered on measures and strategies for tackling unpaid care work in the country and the society at large.

In the course of this year, we will establish a Social Impact Reorientation Program for Young Boys and Girls in primary and secondary schools in Nigeria starting with the FCT, with support from Ministry of Education, UBEC and SUBEB. This program is to reach the younger generation and 'Catch them young'.

The program will focus on Policy Literacy and other policies that are applicable to them as young people and as Nigerians. It will also focus on ways to enhance their understanding on what inclusive governance is.

We will also continue with our community advocacy on the importance of women's role in community leadership, participation in decision making, politics and policy literacy





GSAI will also be working on its short film project titled MARA focused on mental health and third person trauma, this is especially important as this an area that is unspoken about in main stream conversation when it comes to mental health.
